ELL	<p><u>ELL CLASSES</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Beginning ELL requires a 3-ring binder with dividers and a 3-hole punched two-pocket folder. • Intermediate ELL requires a 3-ring binder with 3 dividers and paper, 2 pens and pencils, a daily planner and a folder. • Advanced ELL requires notebook paper either in a notebook or a binder, a folder, pens or pencils and a daily planner or a specific place to write assignments. <p><u>LANGUAGE ARTS CLASSES</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Beginning ELL Language Arts requires a 1 ½ inch 3-ring binder.

Math	<p>All math classes require the following:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Three-ring binder with loose leaf paper (no spiral bound notebooks) 2. Pencils and erasers 3. Calculator <ol style="list-style-type: none"> a. Students enrolled in any mathematics class should have a TI-84 Plus Graphing Calculator. When shopping for a calculator, there will be ones with higher numbers – 85, 86, 89 – do not be tempted to purchase these just because of the higher numbers – 85, 86, 89 – do not be tempted to purchase these just because of the higher number. Only the TI-84 Plus performs the statistical calculations needed in later courses, these others do not. Teachers teach the keystrokes needed for the TI-84; for any other calculator, students will be on their own to learn the methods. Students are not allowed to use the TI-89 on tests and quizzes. This will be the calculator of choice for the remainder of a student’s high school career. <p>Some math classes require the following:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Carbon paper – Some teachers ask student to turn in a carbon copy of homework assignments. Students will occasionally need a sheet of carbon paper. 2. Colored pencils – These are used frequently in all levels of Geometry and Precalculus. It is advisable for students in these classes to purchase a set of colored pencils. 3.
